- **Drug Abuse Prevention Intervention Research (R21)**

National Institutes of Health

Funds will be used to advance the science of drug abuse and drug related HIV prevention. The grant will be awarded based on the development of novel and practical prevention techniques. Research is intended to provide pathways toward the prevention of drug abuse and dependence, drug-related problems, and drug related illness.

Eligible Applicants: Nonprofit organizations; city, state, and county governments; special district governments; public, state, and private institutions of higher education; independent school districts; public housing authorities; and Native American tribes.

Deadline: September 7, 2011.

Award Amount: \$200,000.

- **Graduate Research Fellowship**

National Institute of Justice

The grant is an annual program that provides assistance to outstanding doctoral students undertaking independent research related to crime and justice. Students from any academic discipline may propose original research that has direct implications for criminal justice in the United States.

Eligible Applicants: Doctoral students.

- **Global Climate Change Education**

National Aeronautics and Space Administration

The grant will be used for Earth system science education at the elementary, secondary, and undergraduate levels. Each proposal is expected to take advantage of NASA's contributions to enhance student experiences or educators' ability to stimulate their students.

Eligible Applicants: Nonprofit organizations; city, state, and county governments; special district governments; public, state, and private institutions of higher education; independent school districts; public housing authorities; and Native American tribes.

Deadline: October 24, 2008.

Award Amount: \$150,000 awarded to 20 applicants and \$500,000 awarded to 4 applicants.

- **K-12 Competitive Education Grant Program**

National Aeronautics and Space Administration

Funds will be used for NASA-themed content in support of high school education. Each proposal is expected to employ NASA's contributions in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics to enhance student experiences or educators' ability to stimulate their students.

Eligible Applicants: Nonprofit organizations; city, state, and county governments; special district governments; public, state, and private institutions of higher education; independent school districts; public housing authorities; and Native American tribes.

Deadline: October 27, 2008.

Award Amount: 6 to 8 awards valued from \$750,000 to \$1,500,000, paid over 2 year period.

- **Computational Mathematics**

National Science Foundation

This grant will fund mathematical research in computing, algorithm design, numerical method, and symbolic method. Proposals should embody innovative computational methods, interdisciplinary team projects, or solve important application problems.

Eligible Applicants: Nonprofit organizations; city, state, and county governments; special district governments; public, state, and private institutions of higher education; independent school districts; public housing authorities; and Native American tribes.

Deadline: December 15, 2008.

Award Amount: \$30,000 to \$300,000 awarded to 70 applicants.

- **NEA American Masterpieces: Dance, FY 2009**

National Endowment for the Arts

The grant will fund projects that are artistically, historically, and culturally significant, and reflect the breadth of dance forms, styles, and techniques across America. All projects must be accompanied by related educational, interpretive, or contextual components. These may include lectures, master classes, seminars, exhibitions, study guides, or cooperative learning projects with educational or community institutions.

Eligible Applicants: Nonprofit organizations; city, county and state governments; special district governments; independent school districts; private, public, and state controlled institutions of higher education; and Native American tribes.

Deadline: October 24, 2008.

Award Amount: \$15,000 to \$150,000.

- **NEA American Masterpieces: Visual Arts Touring, FY 2009**

National Endowment for the Arts

The grant will fund performances, exhibitions, tours, and other educational programs which celebrate the evolution of the visual arts. All projects must show for 8 to 12 weeks, and be capable of being scaled in small and medium sized exhibition halls. Each proposal must be accompanied by related educational, interpretive, or contextual components. Substantial effort should be used to reach underprivileged communities.

Eligible Applicants: Nonprofit organizations; city, county and state governments; special district governments; independent school districts; private, public, and state controlled institutions of higher education; and Native American tribes.

Deadline: September 19, 2008.

Award Amount: \$30,000 to \$300,000.

- **NEA AccessAbility Program, FY 2009**

National Endowment for the Arts Funds will be awarded to projects which provide career opportunities or arts programming for individuals with disabilities, older adults, or

those in healthcare settings. The agency plans to award one grant to each project, and each grant has the opportunity to be renewed for four years.

Eligible Applicants: Nonprofit organizations; city, county and state governments; special district governments; independent school districts; private, public, and state controlled institutions of higher education; and Native American tribes.

Deadline: August 27, 2008.

Award Amount: 3 grants each valued at \$50,000 to \$75,000.
