

## **Congressman John Yarmuth Nomination Process U.S. House of Representatives Page Program**

### **What does a congressional Page do for the House of Representatives?**

Pages are employees of the House and their duties consist primarily of delivering correspondence, legislative material and small packages within the Congressional Complex. A few Pages are assigned to answer phones in the Members' Cloakrooms, take messages for Members, call them to the phone if they are in the House Chamber, prepare for House floor sessions and process incoming requests for Page service.

### **Are Pages paid positions?**

Yes. As employees of the House, Pages are paid a salary. Pages earn \$21,134.00 annually, with a monthly gross salary of \$1,761.91. Automatic deductions are made for federal and state taxes, social security and the Residence Hall fee. Pages are paid on the last working day of the month. Pages who do not have health insurance are eligible for insurance during their time in Washington. Pages also receive a daily meal stipend.

### **What costs are the Pages responsible for?**

A \$400 room and board fee is deducted from the Page salary each month. This covers all dormitory expenses, most meals and the basic costs associated with field trips and activities. Pages are also responsible for transportation to and from Washington and the purchase of apparel in accordance with the Page Program's dress code. The dress code is a navy blue blazer, dark grey skirts or slacks, black (tie-up or loafer style) shoes, and a uniform tie.

### **What do Pages do when they are not working?**

On weekends, Pages participate in organized activities such as attending professional sporting events, cultural events at the Kennedy Center and amusement parks. The Page dormitory also includes television rooms, computer labs and other common living space for recreational time.

### **What security measures are in place for the Pages?**

The Page dormitory, located just two blocks from the House Office Building, is staffed 24 hours a day and all security is conducted by Capitol Police Officers. When leaving the dormitory Pages are required to sign out, and Pages must travel in groups of at least two students at all times. All people entering the dormitory, including Pages and dormitory staff, must pass through metal detectors and x-ray screening. When Pages arrive in DC, they are issued GPS phones to monitor their travel. Computers in the dormitory computer lab are set to block MySpace, Facebook and most instant message websites.

### **How does the office prefer to receive applications?**

Please mail or deliver the Application, transcript and letters of recommendation in one packet to be received in my downtown office no later than 5:00pm on Monday March 29, 2010.
